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### **Executive Summary**



### GSA Networx Wake-Up Call:

 While 86% of Networx contractors expect their Networx revenue to increase in 2012, just 13% of agencies say they will make more Networx purchases this year

### Cost Savings Disconnect:

- 95% of industry respondents say Federal agencies are more focused on cost savings today than in 2011, but just one in three is reducing their pricing as a result
- The majority of industry (60%) respond by delivering greater value for the same price

### Mixed Signals:

- While all recognize the savings opportunity in cloud computing, industry says data center consolidation will offer agencies the greatest savings over the next 12 months
- Government sees greater value in telework

### Infrastructure Challenges:

- Despite growing network needs and "the mobility spring," agencies and industry expect just moderate improvement in the percentage of wireless agency telecommunications over the next year – from 28% in 2011 to 36% in 2012
- Additionally, just 50% of Feds believe their agency is taking best advantage of the cyber security tools vendors can provide




### **GSA Networx Wake-Up Call**

Feds and industry see vastly different pictures for Networx in 2012

The GSA Networx is the largest set of government contracts for civilian telecommunication to date in the U.S. It consists of two contract vehicles – Networx Universal and Networx Enterprise – which enable Federal agencies to build seamless, secure operating environments through customized telecommunications services.



Take Away: Industry Must Recognize the Right Buyer




# **Cost Savings Disconnect**

How is your organization responding to agencies' cost/budget concerns?\*




Take Away: Government Getting More Bang for Their Buck





 Government and industry do not see eye to eye on the next greatest savings opportunity for agencies, disagreeing considerably on data center consolidation and telework

## **Is Anyone Listening?**

 Government sees cloud and telework as the answer; industry sees cloud and data center consolidation. How can we achieve savings if we're not even on the same line?



Offers the greatest opportunity for government savings:

#### **Telework:**

25% of Feds vs.

8% of industry

#### Data center consolidation:


19% of Feds vs.

Take Away: Prepare for Device Deluge




### Infrastructure Challenges

 Despite growing network needs, Feds and industry recognize cracks in the foundation of agency network connections


#### **Lack of Wireless**

Government agencies and industry expect just *moderate improvement* in the percentage of wireless agency telecommunications over the next year.



### **Security Gaps**

Are Federal agencies taking **best advantage** of the cyber security tools that vendors can provide?



Take Away: Work Together to Strengthen the Network





- Plug Back In While industry recognizes the government spending crunch, it needs to modify its expectations and approaches to fit within the new cost conscious-reality
- Check Caller ID Fed CIOs are not making purchasing decisions. Industry must reconnect with their true buyers – IT managers and directors
- Pick up the Phone Government and industry must openly discuss priorities to ensure industry vendors are providing the right tools and industry consultants are working toward the same goals
- Call for Service To move forward, government and industry must address critical network issues like wireless access and security





### **Methodology and Demographics**

 MeriTalk, on behalf of CenturyLink and Telework Exchange, conducted the online survey of 163 Federal government and industry employees in February and March 2012. The report has a margin of error of +/- 7.64% at a 95% confidence level
